The Student Activities Awards Banquet is a time when individuals, organizations, and clubs are recognized for their outstanding semester achievements. This year the college has asked that we provide some additional reporting as to how our clubs and organizations contribute to the educational atmosphere of RCC. Therefore, we are implementing an End of the Year report, which we will also use to determine individual and club awards. A committee will review all nominations and make the final selections.

Attached you will find forms for the End of the Year report and the awards categories: Advisor of the Year, Club Member of Distinction, Club Awards, and Individual ASRCC Awards. Please compile and return these forms TYPED via email to <a href="mailto:studentactivities@rcc.edu">studentactivities@rcc.edu</a> no later than MONDAY, MAY 6, 2024 by 5 pm. This year we will be doing voting for the awards online. Once all of the nomination packets have been received, we will compile the nominations and send them to the clubs to submit their vote due Friday May 17. It will be one vote per club. The award winners will be announced at the banquet.

The awards banquet is scheduled for Thursday, May 30 6 pm at Marinaj Banquets & Events in Moreno Valley (off Alessandro). Attire for the evening is semi-formal. RSVPS for the banquet will be sent to students after May 1 and will be due by May 17, 2024.

Students who failed to turn in service hour logs (due April 26th) are ineligible to receive service hour awards, club member of distinction, club president, other club, individual, and ASRCC awards. Upon receipt, service hours are tallied and invitations are sent to qualifying (50 hours or more) students. Please check with your students and nominate eligible students for special awards. We will not make an exception and accept late service hours. Clubs will not be eligible to receive awards if they are not chartered or in good standing.
