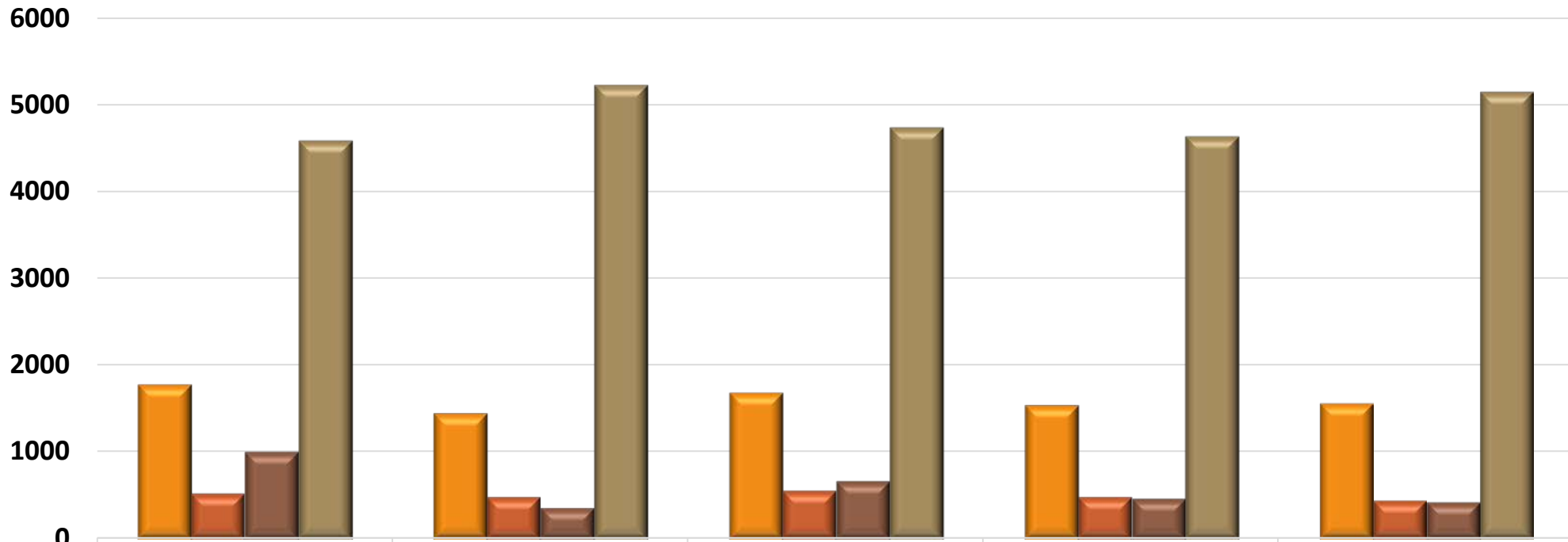

6. Percentage of Students with an Education Plan

## **Efficiency**

7. Number of FTES spent to obtain “higher order outcome” (certificate, degree, transfer, or transfer prepared within 6 years (efficient = declining rate))

## **Access**

8. Participation rate
9. Participation rate among subgroups



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
