Budget Update

Once the weather dries enough to allow it, teams will be excavating about 8 feet down to apply a water sealant. Once that is done, the damaged walls and flooring will be replaced.

The football field benches have also been dislodged as a result of the rain. These will be replaced after the football field and throwing sports field have been repaired.

The committee unanimously asked that RDAS make a commitment to find a solution to protect students in the event of an active shooter. Currently, there are either manual or electronic locks on classrooms, depending on building. While many of the manual doors have lock-bloks, the electronic doors cannot have them because this would result in a motor being burned out. However, the electronic locks cannot be locked from inside the classroom. There is a classified professional who can engage all of the electronic locks on campus, but that only accounts for a fraction of the classrooms and offices on campus and that person is only available during their work hours. The matter will be discussed more indepth at the next meeting.

Add this to the next meeting agenda and invite campus Police Chief (ask Natalie), Krysten Mendes, and Sean DiSalvio.

Technology Resources:

The touch displays are still being piloted:

- Some apple users have to use work arounds to connect to displays
 - Clevershare has issues working with iOS
- Some instructors refuse to use the pilot rooms at all
- Otherwise, feedback has been overall positive

TSS has been working on a Service Catalog and Service Level Agreement to provide end-users with a clearer idea of what services TSS provides and the time in which those services can be expected.

Stephen Ashby is working on getting quotes to spend out the remaining HEERF dollars and then the rest of the COVID Block Grant.

Computer refresh that was previously put on hold will resume over Summer '23.

The classroom upgrades that were tabled during the last program review were updated with a more thorough breakdown of components and costs and were slightly re-structured: class A/V would be upgraded with the ability to have HyFlex options added at a later date rather than from the outset.
