- Curriculum Institute Recap
 - O Chair Burchett gave a brief summary of his attendance at the institute over the summer, especially in regards to his new role as chair, and the responsibilities of the curriculum chair in relation to other governing bodies such as the Academic Senate.
- SLO (ACCJC) versus Objectives (Title 5) possibly being listed on COR's.
 - This topic was initially discussed by Chair Burchett, as part of the curriculum institute. This led to further discussion by the committee.
 - Marc Sanchez and Nancy Gall discussed the "ad hoc" committee that was formed to discuss the possibility of adding the "course objective" field to our course outlines of records.

- Marc Sanchez will forward a synopsis of arguments for/against of these discussions for the committee to review. This will be a part of the larger discussion District-Wide in the future.
- UC Pathway "Common Core"
 - O Chair Burchett discussed the differences between the Associates Degree for Transfer Degrees (ADT's), and their use by the Cal State University System.
 - This led to a discussion of how the University of California System has yet to fully adopt a pathway system, but is moving forward with their initiative.
 - UC Pathway and "Common Core"
 - A basic "pathway" has been agreed upon by the UC system.
 - There are several pathway disciplines that have been reviewed:
 - Anthropology; Biology; Biochemistry; Cell Biology;
 Chemistry; Economics; Mathematics; Molecular Biology;
 Physics; Sociology.
 - However, currently there are no guarantees of a student being accepted into the UC system, nor are there system-wide standards in place (each UC University has differing criteria).

F. Curriculum Policy & Procedure:

- As part of the adopted Content Review policies for Prerequisites and Co-requisites of interdisciplinary communication or computational skills, an "ad hoc" curricular sub-committee was created this last school year. To the knowledge of the committee, the representatives are Stacy Cerwin-Bates (Reading), John Grenfell (Mathematics), and Lani Kreitner (English).
 - This sub-committee will meet when a course is proposing changes to their course prerequisite or co-requisites that may include communication or computational skill requirements.
- Comprehensive Program Review Timeline
 - o It is the understanding to this committee that all departments at City College will be conducting comprehensive program review this school year.
 - o This may lead to a tremendous amount of work for curricular
- TBA Courses
 - o Naomi Foley (District Offices) has compiled a file of all courses offered at City College with a TBA option.
 - o Chair Burchett will forward this file to the committee.
 - o All courses with a TBA option must either:
 - Remove the TBA option from the course outline, or
 - Signify on the course outline of record the laboratory portion of the course, which is offered TBA to the students. Rationale and justification, in some means, is required to show the time spent and how performance is graded for the students.
- AOE/GE Course Revision Timeline
 - The Gen-Ed Workgroup is working on proposals to current AOE/GE policy revisions.

- Until the workgroup makes its recommendations, and changes are approved through the curriculum and senate, current policy will be followed.
- The revision deadline for submission of changes will be either February, or early March of 2016, to allow formal discussions and action prior to publication of Fall 2016 course catalog.

- CID course approvals between colleges (Pardee)
 - o Ron Pardee inquired with the committee situations that have arisen where a course that is District-Wide have had differential approval at the State CID level.
 - Discussion ensued about having faculty double-check with articulation officers and with CID reviewers.
 - Sylvia Thomas dealt with this issue this last year, and it was agreed upon at the State level that when courses were packaged together for review, that similar outcomes for approval (accept, conditional or rejection) would be expected.

F. Curriculum Policy & Procedure:

- Impact of courses losing CID transferability on existing ADT programs:
 - Discussion on rare instances where courses that were approved for CID either were given conditional re-approval or denial, based on changes to the course outline of record.
 - o Possible impacts of the loss of CID transferability, and how they can affect an ADT associates transfer pattern.
 - Mahon reminded the committee that this is most important in "required" courses within the ADT, when compared with "elective" courses, where some flexibility for students remains.
 - Reminder to committee to stay vigilant with courses within their discipline for CID approval, as well as other courses that may impact their ADT curricular patterns.

• Units of residence:

- O Discussion on rare instances where students don't have the 15-units required to claim residency with one of the three colleges within the District. These students are qualified to receive an Associates Degree, but are then required to take additional units (to equal fifteen units) of their chosen college to be awarded a degree from that college.
- The District does not offer AA degrees specific colleges do.

Honors contract courses:

- The Honors Program was developed with the intent of enhanced curricular experiences for students. Through the curricular process, separate Honors courses have been developed to offer students these experiences.
- There have been several instances where faculty have offered "contract's" with students who take a non-honors section of a course, and by offering additional coursework, have attempted to give honors credit to the student.
- Discussion on the development of the Honors Program, the pedagogy of the Honors Program, and on students that have entered into these contracts in fact do not receive Honors Credit on their transcripts.
- Objectives and Outcome placement onto the Course Outline of Record:
 - Potential changes to the Course Outline of Record to differentiate Student Learning Outcomes from Course Objectives had begun in the Fall 2015 semester. Douglass brought up this topic for further discussion.

Counseling Department Recommendation – Changes in Degree Pattern

RCCD - Counseling Discipline Additional Degree Requirements Recommendation

Background

Beginning with our 2015-2016 catalog for our terminal associate degrees (Non-ADT's), students now have the option of selecting which general education pattern to follow: Plan A - RCCD GE - Plan B- CSU GE - Plan C- IGETC.

The District Academic Senate asked the curriculum committee to bring up the discussion about the current Additional Degree Requirements and to send a recommendation to the District Academic Senate from the 3 separate curriculum committees.

The MVC Curriculum Committee requested a recommendation from the RCCD Counseling Discipline.

Now that students have three different options of general education paths to follow to get associate degrees, the Counseling Discipline made the following recommendation on October 29, 2015.

RCCD Counseling Discipline recommendation regarding Additional Degree RequirementsGeneral education pattern to follow: Plan A - RCCD GE - Plan B- CSU GE - Plan C- IGETC

- Create an Area E in the RCCD local pattern.
- Move additional degree requirements into general Education Requirements Area E (5 unit requirement) into RCCD local general education pattern option A.
- This will eliminate additional degree requirements for students following Plan B- CSU GE Plan C- IGETC for students planning to transfer (to mirror requirements for the AD-Ts).
- At this time, the RCCD Counseling Discipline is not requesting to add additional courses to the proposed Area E and a separate process will be followed as required by the curriculum process.

Research

The Articulation Officers researched other community colleges in California to see what has been done regarding adding an area E to local GE. They reviewed A.A. / A.S. degrees and graduation requirements 2015-2016 for several colleges including Mt. San Antonio College, Mt. San Jacinto College, Citrus College, College of the Desert, Long Beach City College, Los Angeles Trade Technical College among others.

The Articulation Officers found that the majority of the California community colleges researched have added an Area E – Health, Wellness and Self Development to the local GE pattern. Other col-

leges call it a variety of self-development categories including, but not limited to: Life-Long understanding, Self-Development, Kinesiology and Self – Development, Healthful Living, Life Skills. Therefore, this recommendation aligns with GE patterns found at other community colleges in California.

Additional rationale for supporting incorporating courses into Plan A RCCD GE area E:

- GE modifications can take place such as course additions, course removals, etc.
- All students following Plan A RCCD GE will still be completing HES1 and self-development courses which is the current practice.

 - Pro arguments for this motion:
 - o Benefit to students of a terminal degree, in the event that they drop out of college, or don't complete their educational plan.
 - o Preserve the "local" degree offered by Riverside City College.
 - Elimination of any "double-standard" for CSU students transferring in which the ADT students have fewer "requirements" to obtain a degree, when compared with local AA/AS degree awardees.
 - Recognition that the newly available CSUGE/IGETC patterns for the RCC GE option is a higher unit load than students obtaining the AA/AS RCC general education plan.
 - Con arguments for this motion:
 - Misinterpretation of whether the units as part of KIN/HES courses (and their units) would be required or not for the local degree, and for the transfer degree patterns.
 - The perceived "lowering of standards" in order to offer more degrees, with students taking fewer units towards their transfer patterns.
