# Committee Reporting & Responsibilities




The Riverside City College Assessment Committee (RAC) is a standing committee of the Riverside City College Academic Senate as established by Article III, Section 5 of the Academic Senate By-Laws.

The Assessment Committee recognizes the dual purpose of assessment as both summative and formative. While the committee strives to meet the external accountability demands of the accrediting commission and acknowledges the role of assessment in college planning processes and resource allocation decisions, its focus is on the intrinsic value of assessment as a means of improving student learning.

The Assessment Committee supports student learning outcomes assessment by facilitating college-based activities and discussion, and by consulting with and providing guidance to departments, disciplines, and other units undergoing program review. The committee seeks to foster engagement in student learning outcomes assessment by encouraging dialogue related to pedagogy and curriculum and supporting college-wide assessment efforts.

The overall goal of the committee is to improve student success and learning, thus helping the College fulfill its educational mission. The assessment process provides the college with evidence that allows it to strengthen the content and delivery of its curriculum and services by identifying areas of strength and areas for improvement. Assessment is more meaningful and likely to lead to improvement when students are committed to learning and the faculty and staff who deliver the programs and services own the process.



Below you will find a list of your duties as a RAC representative:

- Attending monthly meetings and voting on various action items. Meetings are held in Zoom on the first Friday of every month from noon to 2:00 p.m.
- Reporting back to your discipline and/or department important happenings from RAC meetings. You might report back an interesting equity resource, for example, or an upcoming ILO assessment. You can also report back any questions or conversations we have in the meeting as they relate to your discipline and/or department assessments.
- Bringing questions and/or concerns from the discipline and/or department to RAC meetings. Acting as a liaison between RAC and your discipline and/or department.
- Facilitating assessment projects in the discipline and/or department, assisting with entering discipline and/or department results into Nuventive, training new discipline and/or department members in assessment practices and Nuventive.
- Participating in ILO assessments.
- Participating in assessment-related flex activities.

### **Nuventive Guide**

Nuventive is the program RCC uses to schedule, track, and update SLO assessments. RAC chairs have created a step-by-step guide with written instructions, screen shots, and videos to walk you through using Nuventive. The <u>Nuventive Training Manual</u> is a linked document with a detailed table to contents, so you can quickly find what you are looking for and navigate right to that topic.


### Assessment Guide

In addition, this Guide has an appendix of important information including what assessment is and how it works, what the levels of assessment are, how to create an assessment cycle, and more.


# **RAC Websites**



RAC has two websites that can be accessed through RCC.edu. The first site is for <u>faculty and</u> <u>staff</u>. This site contains information about all of the following:

- Reporting forms for part-time faculty
