### WHAT MY DISSERTATION TAUGHT ME ABOUT INCLUSION: A CAMPUSWIDE LOOK AT ROLES, BARRIERS, AND EQUITY IMPACT\*

	This session shares key findings from a phenomenological study examining how community college professional staff perceive their roles in campus diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) efforts. Although staff are among the most diverse and student-connected employee groups, they are often left out of DEI conversations, professional learning, and decision-making—creating unintentional barriers to inclusion, belonging, and organizational change. Participants will explore how these findings connect to RCC’s equity priorities and discuss how faculty, classified professionals, and managers collectively shape the student experience. Together, we will identify practical strategies to strengthen cross-role collaboration, reduce hierarchical barriers, and cultivate a campus culture where every employee feels valued and empowered to contribute to equitable student outcomes.

### INTRO TO LGBTQIA2S+ ALLYSHIP, STUDENT SUPPORT AND ADVOCACY\*
