# **VOCATIONAL NURSING (VN) INFORMATION SHEET**

#### **General Information**

- The Vocational Nursing (VN) program is approved by the Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians (BVNPT) and is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN), Inc. - 2. Applicants who have met all RCC general education requirements are eligible to earn an *Associate in Science Degree in Vocational Nursing (VN)* upon completion of the VN program and general education courses.
- 3. Applicants who have not met all RCC general education requirements are eligible to earn a *Certificate of Achievement* upon completion of the VN program.
- 4. The VN program graduate is eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-PN) for licensure as a Vocational Nurse in the State of California.
- 5. The VN Program requires 12 months of full-time study.
- 6. Each Fall semester up to 70 candidates are accepted into the program. Those applicants who are not accepted must reapply the following year. There is no wait list.

# **Application to the School of Nursing:**

Students applying to the School of Nursing must have all eligibility and prerequisite requirements completed or in progress at the time of application. The applicant is responsible for ensuring that <u>ALL</u> official up-to-date transcripts and other necessary documentation have been received by Riverside City College at the time of application.

- 1. Admission will be denied to an applicant who earned a grade of "C-" or less in a Vocational Nursing Program at another college.
- 2. Foreign transcripts must have a "Detailed Evaluation," and be submitted by the application deadline. Information can be obtained from the Counseling Office.
- 3. Students must have applied to RCC prior to submitting an application to the VN Program.
- 4. <u>Meeting the minimum requirements of the program does not guarantee admission into the program.</u>

#### **Application Filing Period**

The application filing period for the VN program is from the first business day of February to the first business day of March. Check the RCC School of Nursing web site or e-mail <a href="mailto:nursing@rcc.edu">nursing@rcc.edu</a> for exact dates.

# Requirements for Eligibility and Prerequisite Courses:

NOTE: Meeting the minimum eligibility criteria for the program does not guarantee admission to the program.

- 1. Complete an RCC application on CCCApply and be eligible to attend RCC.
- 2. Graduation from an accredited high school or equivalent (G.E.D., High School Proficiency Examination, Associate degree or Bachelor's degree). Official up-to-date transcripts required.
- 3. A cumulative grade point average of at least a 2.0 ("C") in all college course work attempted.
- 4. Be at least 17 years of age (Section 2866a, VN Nursing Practice Act).
- 5. Prerequisite Courses (11 units):
  - a. BIO 45 or BIO 50 A and BIO 50 B
  - b. Nursing 55 A and Nursing 55 B
  - c. Psychology 9
- 6. A valid and current California C.N.A Certificate.
  - a. An Active CNA certificate is required at the time of application for all VN program applicants.
  - b. Students admitted to the VN program must maintain and keep their CNA certificate Active and verifiable throughout the program.

## **Anatomy and Physiology Requirement**

Riverside City College encourages students to complete the entire series of Anatomy and Physiology at one school. This is due to the concern of possible missing components in curriculum when completed at separate colleges. Nursing applicants that have taken Anatomy and Physiology at two separate colleges are required to receive approval for these courses by requesting a "Course Equivalency" form from the Counseling or Evaluations Departments.

#### **Transcript Requirements**

Transcripts are "Official" when they are sent directly to RCC from the sending institution, or are hand-delivered by the student in a sealed envelope from the sending institution. Copies of transcripts/diplomas not accepted. Transcripts are "Up-to-date" when they are received by RCC no more than 90 days after the sending institution issued them, as verified by the date that the institution stamps on the transcript. If you need to request an official copy of your transcripts from other colleges previously attended, please visit the <a href="Parchment">Parchment</a> website. A transcript Request form is available in the Transfer Career Center. Transcripts that are not official and not up-to-date will be returned to the student, and will lower priority status if the official transcript is not submitted by the deadline. Please be aware that your transcripts will be purged after one year if you have never been enrolled at RCC, or if you have not been an RCC student for four years.

#### **Selection Procedure**

Selection for the VN program is competitive, with a varying percentage of spaces going to fully qualified applicants with the highest points (See Vocational Nursing Program Point System) and a varying percentage filled by random selection of qualified applicants. RCC reserves the right to designate a certain number of spaces for contract agreements and/or to meet grant-designated outcomes.

If a student is not offered a space in the program, a new application is necessary in the next application period. The School of Nursing has no wait list.

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# Additional General Education Requirements (for Associate Degree in Vocational Nursing only)

The following general education courses are not required for admission to the VN program; rather, they are required for the completion of the ADN (VN) degree. Most students complete these requirements before entering the VN program due to the rigorous course load. The courses listed below are not required to earn a Certificate of Achievement

A minimum grade of "C" (75%) in each course is required in order to progress in the VN Program.

# Expenses (per year)

- 1. Students pay Health Services (\$50), parking (\$150), Student Services Fees (\$10) and tuition (\$46) per unit each semester. The cost is approximately \$2,550 for 12 months.
- 2. Students furnish their own uniforms. The cost is approximately \$250.
- 3. The costs of nursing books and supplies are approximately \$2,000.
- 4. Physical examination/lab work costs are approximately \$98 \$600.
- 5. Background checks/CPR costs approximately \$220.
- 6. It is recommended that students carry personal health and accident insurance including hospitalization. Policies are available to college students at reasonable rates. The college provides liability insurance at no cost to the student.
- 7. Students are required to purchase standardized testing package with a live NCLEX Review for use during the program. Estimated cost is \$1200.00.

When planning expenses, students should be aware they may have to limit their hours of employment due to extensive VN Program requirements. Scholarships and grants are available to those students who qualify.

### **Health Exam and CPR Certification**

Students will be admitted to the program pending submission of a CPR card (American Heart Association BLS Healthcare Provider Course) valid for 2 years, and a completed health examination form with clearance permitting unrestricted functional activities essential to nursing practice in accordance with the American with Disabilities Act (1990). Health Exam and CPR Certification are not required at the time of application.

## **Background Check and Drug Screen**

All new and readmitting students are required to demonstrate a clear background check and drug screen prior to enrollment in clinical courses. See the "Background Check/Drug Screen" policy for further details. The background check requires that students be able to provide a valid social security number. The process for obtaining the background check is available in the School of Nursing office.

# <u>California Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians</u>: Substantial Relationship Criteria: (BVNPT 16 CCR 2521)

An applicant with a criminal conviction is permitted to apply for licensure, and to take the licensure examination if they meet all of the education and experience requirements. The final determination on the application with a criminal conviction is made only after the applicant takes and passes the licensure examination. By permitting an applicant to take the licensing examination, the Board does not waive its right to deny licensure based on convictions once an applicant passes the exam. The board will not tell people if they will be approved or not, as each decision is based on the specific facts and circumstances of the case. # Disclosure of Social Security Number/Tax ID Number

If you fail to disclose your social security number or ITIN number, your application for initial or renewal license will not be processed.

### **Fingerprint Requirement**

Applicants for licensure are required to be fingerprinted for purposes of conducting a criminal history record check. The fingerprints remain on file with the California Department of Justice, and that agency provides reports to the Board of any future convictions on an ongoing basis. (Authority: Section 144, Business and Professions Code)

Selection for the VN program is competitive, with a varying percentage of spaces going to fully qualified applicants with the highest points and a varying percentage filled by random selection of qualified applicants. A total of 100 points are possible.
